

The Florida A&M University College of Law was originally established in 1949. The first classes were held in 1951. From 1954 to 1968, there were 57 graduates who went on to become great leaders. The original law school closed in 1968. The FAMU College of Law reopened in 2002.

FAMU Law Successes since re-opening in 2002: has produced more than 2,900 graduates who are lawyers and leaders; 1,800 minority graduates; 1,900 licensed attorneys in Florida; 1,200 licensed minority attorneys in Florida; and also produced 13 sitting judges in Florida, Georgia, and Missouri; and one sitting state attorney in Florida.

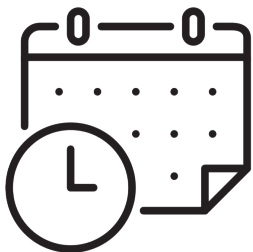
Lowest Tuition for In-State and Out-of-State Law Students in Florida
