Florida Law Schools' Consortium on Racial Justice Fellowship



FLSCRJ Fellows selected for the 2021-2022 academic year will work with two Central Florida partners to advance their missions: The Florida Rights Restoration Coalition (FRRC) and Florida Rural Legal Services (FRLS).

Law students will conduct two workshops annually to share outcomes and increase awareness of issues: one workshop targeting the FAMU Law community and the general public, and the other targeting the consortium of 10 other law schools.

Fellows will commit to 10-15 hours a week to FLSCRJ work.
